## 1. CLINICAL CAMP AT BADALPUR (VERAVAL) ON DECEMBER 27, 2013

The Veterinary clinical camp was organized at Badalpur on December 27, 2013 by College of Veterinary Science & Animal Husbandry in collaboration with the District Panchayat, Department of Animal Husbandry at Badalpur. Four staff members Dr. J.S.Patel, Dr. P.B.Patel, Dr. A.M.Patel and Dr. R. J.Raval took active participation in the clinical camp.

Animals from Badalpur and surrounding villages were registered and were provided expert diagnosis and treatment facilities. During the Camp two thousand one hundred eighty eight (2188) animals were treated for different Surgical, Gynaecological and Medical ailments. Case details: Surgery- fourteen (14), Gynaecology- forty six (46), Medicine- fifty eight (58), Deworming cases – two thousand seventy (2070). One hundred twenty seven animal owners (127) brought their animals for the treatment.

## 2. CLINICAL CAMP AT BHANWAD ON DECEMBER 29, 2013

Another successive Veterinary clinical camp was organized at Bhanwad on December 29, 2013 in collaboration with Bhanwad Mahajan Panjarapol at Bhanwad.

Dr. A. M. Parakhiya, Director of Extension Education, Junagadh Agricultural University, Junagadh presided over the function. Dr. P.H. Tank, Principal & Dean emphasized the importance of field clinical services by the experts for prospective development of education, research and extension activities of the developing Veterinary colleges. He encouraged the staff and students for the clinical services to the livestock owners of the remote areas. Eight Staff members ; Dr. J.S. Patel, Dr. P.B. Patel, Dr.K.B.Vala, Dr. S.H.Talekar, Dr. J.V.Vadalia, Dr. B.R. Patel, Dr. K. H. Parmar and Dr. D.T. Fefar took active participation in the clinical camp.

Animals from Bhanvad and surrounding villages were brought in the camp. During the camp ninty two thousand forty five (92045) animals were treated for different Surgical, Gynaecological and Medical ailments. Case details: Surgery- forty five (45), Gynaecology-thirty one (31), Medicine- fifteen thousand eight hundred forty nine (15849), Deworming cases – seventy six thousand one hundred twenty (76120). One thousand sixty animal owners (1060) were the direct beneficiary of the Camp.
